# About this book

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*The Agile Student* is intended to create a new generation of professionals in industry to fulfil not only today's employers' needs, but those of the future. Those students and apprentices interested in gaining an advantage in today's competitive job market can do so through acquiring the most sought-after employability skills.

The word 'apprentice' means a young person on a company training scheme; in this book I use the word in a more general sense to cover such students, as well as university students on internships or one-year placements, and new graduates in industry.

## *What does 'agile' mean?*

The term 'agile' can be applied to the physical aspects of a person moving rapidly and easily. In this book, it refers to the internal mindset of a person to understand, think and act quickly in academia and the workplace.

## *What are the benefits for the reader?*

Having an agile mindset develops the following:

- Commercial awareness of an organisation, its corporate objectives and association with the wider world;
- An alignment with the culture and structure of existing and future companies;
- Industry techniques and technological awareness for process improvement and product/service development;
- A high level of emotional intelligence, core to intrapersonal skills and the development of interpersonal skills;
- A multimodal learning style to process information faster;
- An entrepreneurial spirit to take risks in seeking innovation and embracing change for continuous improvement;
- Mental resilience and perseverance to overcome challenges and execute both long-term company objectives and your own career plan.

Such an extensive skillset is desirable for any company operating in a volatile industry. These exist in many sectors including consumer goods, healthcare, transportation, energy, banking, and entertainment and media. High profile multinational companies in these sectors will be analysed to strengthen students' (and apprentices') understanding of 'agile' practices in the workplace.

### *What are the broader benefits?*

Tackling the skills deficit is fundamental for any government, industry or educational strategy to be viable. *The Agile Student* is the missing link between academia and industry, and offers a new way of thinking and behaving, to build a strong pipeline of talented students and apprentices, who match company needs for future growth: to raise productivity, spread prosperity and open up new paths to economic growth.

# Who is this book for?

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This book is for all students, regardless of their field of study, to recognise the significance of having a definitive skillset and its practical application to their career plan, in academic life and the professional world. There are many academic courses suitable for careers in a variety of industries, and others that are more specific. A majority of students will work in industries that can be categorised into the following six sectors:

**Consumer Goods** includes industries such as fashion for those studying textiles or graphic design, and consumer electronics for those studying electronic engineering or computer science.

**Healthcare** includes pharmaceuticals for those studying sciences, and the medical field for those studying medicine, or nursing.

**Transportation** includes the automotive industry for those studying engineering disciplines (electrical, electronic, or mechanical), and aerospace for those studying aeronautical engineering and electronics/software engineering.

**Energy** includes oil and gas for those studying engineering disciplines (chemical, civil, electrical, mechanical), and agriculture for students studying environmental sciences (biology, chemistry, geography, botany or ecology).

**Finance** includes investment banking for those studying finance, accounting, management, or any engineering or science discipline.

**Entertainment and Media** includes film, radio, television and theatre for those studying subjects such as media studies, performing arts, journalism, cinematography or special effects/film editing.

Readers hoping to work in other sectors should still find the employability skillset of great use, as it is designed to be transferable to any industry.
